

UW Protesters Set New Rally at 11 a.m. Today

University of Wisconsin students met Tuesday night in three separate meetings on campus to outline plans for demonstrations today.

Black student leaders said the main demonstrations would begin with a rally at 11 a.m. today in Great Hall of the Memorial Union.

The rally is to be preceded by a meeting of black students, but details of the meeting were not released.

More than 500 students crowded into the Commerce Building while another 800 moved to two other lecture halls in the Social Science Building across the street.

"None of this 'pig' stuff," a black student told the groups. "It's strictly non-violent." There was applause, and he added, "We don't want any heads cracked."

Others outlined procedures on what to do if violence does occur. If tear gassed, the advice ran: don't rub your eyes; wash them out with water from small plastic bottles; breathe into plastic bags filled with vinegar-moistened cloth.

After the meetings, the students were told to go back to their living units and talk with other students to get them involved in picketing today.

They were also advised to get plenty of rest.
