

## **WSA Criticizes State Guard Call**

The Wisconsin Student Assn. (WSA) Wednesday criticized the University of Wisconsin administration for agreeing to a call-up of the Wisconsin National Guard to handle campus disturbances.

The WSA said the administration was escalating the problems on campus by its action in "catering to the demands of the Legislature instead of the demands of the academic community."

It said that the WSA was preparing to bring charges against the police who did not wear badges while dealing with the campus disturbances Wednesday. The association declined to say what kind of charges.

The association also commended the teaching assistants for criticizing the "repressive action against the walkout" by students.

Two arrested students were bailed out of jail by the WSA, the group announced. They are Arthur Winnig, 19, of 139 W. Gilman St., from Neenah, and Fred Marshall, 19, Sellery Hall dormitory from Appleton.
