

## 200 City, County Lawmen Called to Campus Again

Nearly 200 Madison and Dane County lawmen were called for extra duty Thursday afternoon when demonstrators again disrupted University of Wisconsin classes.

Chief Wilbur H. Emery, Sheriff Vernon (Jack) Leslie, and County Traffic Police Director Russell W. Klitzman reinstated 12-hour shifts, the same work schedule used during previous campus disruptions.

Sheriff Vernon Goltz and 15 of his Columbia County lawmen voluntarily joined the forces here Thursday.

The overtime cost for lawmen and National Guardsmen during the previous two-week campus demonstrations will exceed \$350,000, the departments' payroll records showed.

Madison police overtime, from Feb. 8 through 21, totaled \$48,063.81, the payroll records keeper, Mrs. Dorothy Trittin said. Sheriff Leslie said his deputies' overtime totaled about \$17,600. The county traffic officers' overtime totaled about \$16,236.

State finance officials estimated the 1,900 guardsmen's pay and expenses at about \$22,000 daily for 10 days they were on campus duty. The 35-member University police force has not yet tabulated its overtime duty pay.

About 140 lawmen from other counties and cities have until Apr. 15 to submit their expenses for campus work the previous two weeks. Their bills are expected to total close to \$50,000.

All the cities and counties plan to bill the state for payment.
