

# Protest Is Called Off; UW Is Quiet

The University of Wisconsin campus was quiet Friday.

About 75 students waited for black students to arrive at a morning rally at 10:30, but dispersed an hour later after the blacks reportedly meeting elsewhere. **MAR 1 1969**

**ONE BLACK** student who has frequently spoken at other rallies said later that Friday's protest was called off because of "too many leaks within the group to police."

Thursday about 200 demonstrators, led by groups of blacks, rampaged through several classroom buildings on the campus, breaking windows, upsetting furniture and vending machines, and throwing stench bombs.

Madison and Dane County police, called in to halt Thursday's violence, were not in evidence on the campus Friday.

**HANDOUTS** distributed Friday outside the Memorial Union announced a mass meeting for 1 p.m. today in the Union's Great Hall, at which time further protest tactics may be discussed.

Another meeting, for 4:30 p.m. Sunday, was called to discuss means of bringing pressure on UW faculty members, who will decide Monday on establishment of a black studies department, one of 13 demands black students have presented to the University administration.
