Afro-American Advisory Group Named by Kleene

Formation of an advisory committee for the University of Wisconsin's Afro-American Center was announced Monday by Stephen C. Kleene, dean of the College of Letters and Science.

The committee will advise the dean and the center's director and serve as a search and screen committee for a new director, Kleene said.

Since the resignation of C. Elrie Chrite Apr. 30, Eugene Parks has been serving as acting director.

Five of the 10-member committee are students: Clarence L. Sherrod and Evelyn L. J. Robinson, both of Milwaukee; Joe W. Adams, Gary, Ind.; John W. Daniels, Madison; and Dial Hewlett, Cleveland, O., committee secretary.

Faculty members are James E. Baugh, assistant to the vice-chancellor for student affairs; Donald J. Harris, economics; James H. Latimer, music, committee chairman; Robert J. Miller, anthropology; and Wilson B. Thiede, curriculum and instruction.

Geraldine S. Hines, Greenville, Miss., was named as an alternate for student members. Miss Robinson and Miller do not plan to be in Madison next fall and will be replaced then by Alfred Lawson, a freshman from Milwaukee; and Prof. Fred M. Hayward, political science.
