
UW Introduces Afro-American Studies Division

The University of Wisconsin Afro-American Studies Department will be introduced formally to the UW and city communities at a reception at 7:30 p.m. Wednesday in the Wisconsin Center.

The department, which began instruction this fall, will award its first degrees in June.

According to Prof. Charles E. Anderson, department chairman, the department has an enrollment of more than 500 students in 10 courses.

About 50 per cent of the students are white. Two of the eight faculty members are white.

Courses range from Afro-American history to economics of black America.

Stephen C. Kleene, dean of the College of Letters and Science, will present the department at the reception. The public is invited.
