

# Jury Continues Bomb Probe

A Federal Grand Jury has continued to probe the Aug. 24 fatal bombing at the University of Wisconsin but further indictments are unlikely, according to U.S. Atty. John Olson.

Olson said the jury is merely "wrapping up a few loose ends of evidence" in the investigation of the blast, which severely damaged the UW's Sterling Hall, killed a physics researcher, and injured four other

persons. The blast was aimed at the U.S. Army Math Research Center.

Subpenas on file with the clerk of courts show that Paul Linde, manager of medical records at UW Hospitals, has been asked to bring all available medical records concerning Karleton L. Armstrong, David S. Fine, and Leo F. Burt to the jury.

The three, along with Dwight

Armstrong, Karleton's younger brother, are charged in connection with the bombing and are believed to have fled to Canada or possibly Cuba.

Paul J. Bracken of Drexel Hills, Pa., a town adjacent to Burt's home town of Haver-town, also has been asked to testify, but Olson declined to say why.

Olson said the jury currently is in recess and probably will reconvene in January.
