Glad He's Caught, Victim's Widow Says

Sterling Hall bombing
Mrs. Robert Fasnacht, widow of a researcher killed in a 1970 University of Wisconsin bombing, said Thursday she was glad to learn of Karleton Armstrong's arrest in Canada.

"It's not a feeling of joy," Mrs. Fasnacht said, "But I'm glad he's been caught. I think people should pay for their crimes."

Mrs. Fasnacht, 34, added that she hoped the trial of Armstrong, one of four persons

sought in the bombing, "doesn't turn into a big political show."

The widow said she was informed of Armstrong's arrest by her babysitter after returning from an errand.
