

Suspects' Dad Gets Time to Fight Subpena

Circuit Judge W. L. Jackman has allowed Donald Armstrong, father of two men charged in the Aug. 24 bombing of the ~~Army Math Research Center~~, another day to fight his subpoena to testify before the Dane County Grand Jury.

The grand jury is presumed to be investigating the Sterling Hall blast which killed one University of Wisconsin researcher and severely damaged several buildings.

JACKMAN scheduled a hearing at 9 a.m. today to determine whether the subpoena to testify violates Armstrong's constitutional rights, as Armstrong contends.

If Jackman rules that the subpoena violates Armstrong's civil rights, Armstrong will be able to avoid testifying before the secret investigating group that has been meeting off-and-on in a basement room of the City-County building for several

weeks.

Madison Atty. Melvin Greenberg, one of three attorneys representing Armstrong, said law enforcement officials have illegally conducted electronic surveillance on Armstrong on at least five occasions.

ARMSTRONG WAS subpoenaed to testify at 3:30 p.m. Monday, but Jackman stayed the enforcement of the subpoena.

Armstrong is represented by Greenberg, Marc Dorfman, and Phillip Lazzara, all of whom are members of three different law firms.

"We have to present a united front against this," Greenberg said Monday.

If Jackman refuses to dismiss the subpoena, the three attorneys are expected to ask Federal Judge James E. Doyle for a dismissal on the same grounds.
