

Presidential Unit to Probe UW Math Center Bombing

the attempted Badger Ordinance fire-bombing in January.

ALSO SATURDAY, a spokesman for Gov. Warren P. Knowles said there are "13 plans at the present time" to call a special meeting of University and state officials to discuss Monday's bombing.

Such a meeting had been requested by State Sen. Ernest Keppler, The Republican majority leader, in a letter Friday in which he suggested that officials gather to discuss 24-hour protection for the Wisconsin campus and other state buildings.

Stephen Boyle, spokesman for Knowles, said that security should not be established in public meetings.

"You don't discuss security plans in public," Boyle said. "You may as well tell your security plans to those whom you are trying to protect against."

FEDERAL officials in Madison also refused to disclose any information regarding the Grand Jury that will convene here Monday to investigate the Math Center bombing.

"I'm really not certain who's going to be called for the Grand Jury," U.S. Atty. John Olson said Saturday. "There are going to be a wide variety of people

Olson said that other persons, in addition to Knops, have been asked to testify Monday, but he refused comment on their identities. He also refused to comment on why he wouldn't comment.

On the University campus Saturday, 24-hour maximum security remained in effect, University Protection and Security Director Ralph Hanson said.

HANSON SAID that there had

been a great deal of response to the \$100,000 reward offered by the University Board of Regents for information leading to the arrest of the bombers.

But Hanson and other law enforcement agencies involved in the investigation refused to say how many "tips" they have received.

"They come in at all hours of the day and night," Madison Police Lt. David Baggott said, "but I don't know that how many is anybody's business."

According to Tim Slater, another Kaleidoscope editor, there will be a "Free Knops" demonstration at 9 a.m. Monday in front of the federal building.

ues on a d d i t i o n s to those schools. Parking shortages are expected at LaFollete for the next few weeks as exterior work progresses.

The \$2.8-million LaFollette addition is expected to be finished in November. Science and humanities pods or clusters of classrooms are ready now, but a fieldhouse, showers, lockers, shops, instructional materials center, and business education facilities aren't finished.

At East, some of the work on the \$3.9-million renovation project is scheduled for 1971
