

# No Phoning Blast Follows UW Bombing

Surprisingly few persons reacted with phone calls and telegrams to the State Capitol in the wake of the fatal bombing of the Army Mathematics Research Center on the University of Wisconsin campus.

"I think the frustration that has so disturbed public officials for so long has finally reached the public," said Stephen E. Boyle, executive secretary to Gov. Warren P. Knowles. "So you call. But what the hell do you say?"

Boyle said the Executive Office received several calls from concerned persons but nothing like the usual barrage following a major catastrophe.

**BOYLE SAID** he received one call from an outstate county supervisor who said he wanted the University shut down.

"It was just the other side of the hard line coin of those who want the school kept open at all costs," he said.

The Executive Office received only two telegrams regarding the Monday morning explosion which demolished the east wing of Sterling Hall, shattered windows for blocks around, killed a young physicist, and injured four other persons.
